

St George's C of E School FRIDAY NEWS 3rd December 2021

At this time of year, we think about what Christmas means to us at St George's. Our Core Christian Values encapsulate the very nature of our school and our community. This is something I notice, every day, as I walk around our school. Children are keen to help each other, whether it be with their learning or if they fall over in the playground. The kindness amongst pupils, staff, parents and governors is tangible but this week in particular we have seen Kindness, Perseverance and Thankfulness in abundance!

Our children have continued to learn with a smile on their faces despite the current restrictions we have in place; we have seen kindness throughout school with lovely messages and gifts for the staffroom being sent in to keep us all going and kind get well wishes given to everyone who is or has been self-isolating.

This week I have been extremely thankful for our amazing staff. It has been a challenging time, but the staff have continued to shine by stepping up to cover all staff absences and ensure face to face learning could continue for our children. It's been exhausting but we have done it.

Covid cases continue to rise in school (as well as the local area) and this week alone we have seen another 17 cases across the school. Our decision (though extremely tough and disappointing) to cancel our usual Christmas events in school has been the right one. Public Health Dorset, informed all schools this week that holding any indoor events, where people are either in close proximity, eating, singing and/or playing wind instruments is considered as 'high risk' and will remain so, until at least the end of the term. The Department for Education has made one small proviso, that made me chuckle, this being if younger children sang quietly and softly, perhaps a small audience could attend a performance. I couldn't help but wonder how many Nativity Plays these people had attended, where the very essence of the production is based on how loudly and forcibly, Reception/Year 1 and Year 2 children can collectively project a version of Little Donkey!

Therefore, please can I ask everyone to continue to be vigilant to symptoms and to test regularly. The vast majority of our cases have been asymptomatic, and it is only through testing that we have been able to identify these. If your child is displaying any symptoms or is unwell please keep them at home until a negative PCR result has been received. I appreciate we are getting closer to Christmas and the one thing we all want is for families to be able to safely spend time together celebrating. We understand that some families are considering taking their children out of school a week before term ends to help protect their family Christmas, and whilst we understand and appreciate the reasons, we are not able to authorise this type of absence.

I am, as is customary at this time of year, reliable informed that there are only 22 sleeps 'til Christmas. I sincerely hope you all have the opportunity to enjoy it with your family and loved ones – and as ever, thank you for your continued support.


William (Hedgehogs) – for trying super hard to make his writing small, use finger spaces and full stops.

Squirrels News

This week has been a very busy one in Squirrels. We began the week by practising our diary writing and then later we became Samuel Pepys writing his diary entries when the Great Fire began to take hold and it was evident he would need to escape – but not before burying his precious cheese and wine in the garden! We have continued to practise our bonds to 100 and our addition and subtraction in maths, together with our Mastering Number sessions daily. In Science we have been finding out more about sound; the children categorised some musical instruments according to high or low pitch (it was very noisy in Squirrels!) and then we talked about the need for ear defenders (!) by some people who use noisy equipment and machinery and we predicted and then experimented with different materials to use in ear defenders, to find out which was best. In Art we made some black and white Tudor houses which are displayed in the classroom and we have also been practising our songs for our Christmas play. Badgers News

In Badgers this week we started to think about what Christmas means to us and different things we do to celebrate it. We got excited thinking about decorations, cards and family gatherings. We then considered the importance of Christmas to Christians. In English we read instructions about how to make a Christingle. We are hoping to make our own Christingle soon but this week we focused on how to structure instructional texts. We then looked at pictures of different craft items and wrote the 'what you need' section focusing on writing a list and using a colon.

In maths we continued comparing fractions and putting fractions on a number-line. We also completed some investigations on used clues to find mystery numbers using our knowledge of fractions.

We went outside and hunted for shadows in Science on Thursday. Fortunately, the sun was shining and we found lots on the playground. We considered how shadows change during different parts of the day due to the position of the sun and earth.

In Maths the theme has been shape and measure and the children now have improved skills in calculating perimeter and area of simple and compound shapes. In Forest School they created beautiful wreaths of holly, ivy, conifer sprigs and pine cones; this involved string and wire tying and twisting along with the patience to create many layers to thicken the circle. The children enjoyed wearing them as thorny crowns! In Music we have spent the last two weeks learning 'The Cup Song'. The children have become quite speedy and competitive. This cup song helps with memory, rhythm, coordination and ensemble playing. It is fascinating to see how a cup, your hands and a table can create music.
