Hedgehogs have been using the computers this week, learning how to use a mouse and create pictures or play phonics games. Year 1 have also been doing really well on their coding programme! Squirrels News

In Squirrels this week, we have completed some assessment tasks for English and Maths and the children focussed really well – despite all the popping in and out for covid tests! We have also been consolidating our learning on addition and subtraction in Maths. In English we have been looking at how verbs in the past tense can have -ed endings or they can completely change the word. We have also focussed on our handwriting and practising our letter formation, sizing and consistency to make our writing more legible. In Art, we practised our drawing techniques by using different lines or shading to create different textures in our pictures. In Forest School we played some games that required fantastic listening and reaction skills. Then we introduced our cuddly friends and shared what we do with them. This led to some discussion about animals in general. Finally, we constructed houses for the animals, using forked sticks that supported the roofs and foliage to increase the coverage. The children were proud of their work. We hope you have a good weekend everyone and stay safe and well.

In Badgers this week we finally wrote our wishing tales. Some wished to be famous singers or expert artists, whilst others wished for various pets or money. In RE we thought about Hanukkah, another festival of light. We watched some videos and considered how and why Jews celebrate Hanukkah. We then had a go playing the traditional game of Dreidel. This was great fun and took perseverance and sticking power.

In Science this week, we have been learning about reflective materials. We looked at a selection of different materials and decided whether they were reflective or non-reflective. We noticed that the materials that were dull and dark were not reflective, and the materials which were shiny and metallic were reflective. We also discussed why we wear Hi-Viz jackets to be seen in the dark and how there needs to be a light source in order to been seen.
