It has been another busy week and there are a few tired children and staff after watching England progress to the final of Euro 2020 on Thursday night. Fingers crossed for Sunday.

I am sure that you would have seen the Government briefing earlier in the week about the further lifting of COVID-19 restrictions on 19th July. The DfE has updated the school guidance in preparation for September. As the end of this term gets closer, our priority is to stay open and we are hoping to be able to keep the children in school but I would ask that everyone remains vigilant to the symptoms.

We have made the decision to continue to operate our current procedures including staggered starts and ends to the days along with our bubbles until the end of this term. We want to ensure everyone can end the year safely without any bubbles popping. We have been extremely lucky that we are one of the very few schools to not have had any bubble closures. Our measures have worked, and we thank you all for supporting us through what has been the most challenging of years. The children have been phenomenal and our staff outstanding for their contribution to keeping us all safe. I am extremely lucky to lead such a wonderful school.

A long letter is due out next week with all the updates for September (I apologise in advance as there is a lot to share) but here are the main headlines:

- Nationally ALL education settings will be open fully from September and attendance for children is mandatory.
- There will be no bubbles from September so we can get together again for assembly and playtimes.
- Staff will continue to test twice a week until the end of September when this will be reviewed by the DFF
- Face coverings will no longer be advised for staff and visitors in either classrooms or communal areas of school.

As a school we have taken the Covid restrictions as an opportunity to rethink how we do things to ensure the children receive the best education possible. We have taken on board comments from the children, staff and parents and put together a plan for us moving forward. Some things we will keep (our Covid Keepers) and other things we will be pleased to see the back of (our Covid Sleepers). The letter coming out next week will explain everything. We are very much looking forward to September – welcoming our new children, new staff and being able to get back to a little more normality.

Hedgehogs have continued writing their story about Norman and how he flew with his fabulous wings. The Word Womble gave us some wonderful verbs to use and we came up with some of our own. The children drew themselves with wings and wrote sentences using verbs like soaring, pirouetting and twirling. Some super 'have-a-go' Hyenas this week at using more expressive language in sentences. Year 1s have worked really hard at writing longer pieces and punctuating every sentence.

In maths we have learnt about odd and even numbers and sorting them into groups, both using practical resources and digit cards. We enjoyed our swimming on Monday, but unfortunately the pool was too cold to swim on Wednesday afternoon - so we enjoyed Wellbeing Wednesday afternoon instead where the children enjoyed activities of their choice instead.

In science we have been investigating objects using our sense of touch. We visited the church with Reverend Ben and learnt about the different areas in the church and how they are used for worship.

Squirrels News

This week in Squirrels we have been looking at different sentence types. The children read sentences and identified if they were a question, a command or a statement, before they wrote their own examples. Later in the week we investigated "homophones" which are words that have the same pronunciation but have different meanings.

In topic the children have been learning about the different bones in our bodies and their jobs. They enjoyed singing along to The Skeleton Dance before they made their very own skeletons using split pins and card.

Finally, in RE the children have been introduced to the religion of Judaism. They have been learning about the Jewish people's beliefs and festivals that they celebrate. We talked about how every Friday evening they celebrate Shabbat by having a special meal, saying prayers and lighting a candle. Mr Abbott

This week in Badgers we have continued our journey with The Lost Words book, in particular exploring a poem called *Weasel*, in which the animal is beautifully described using the metaphor of fire. The children have learnt a lot of new vocabulary and are planning and writing a character description of their own invented weasel. They have also copied out and illustrated one of the poems from the book, with a focus on fantastic handwriting.

In our British countryside topic, the children really enjoyed getting to know how to read, interpret and use an Ordnance survey map. They can now give the four coordinates for any point on the map and have learnt many of the OS symbols too.

Now they can happily be in charge if you feel like a long hike with an OS map!

Today - Friday - we immersed ourselves in French, adding a bit of 'bleu' to the red and white football-related excitement.

Badgers have learnt colours, numbers, classroom instructions and greetings. We discovered that playing *La Marelle*, which is France's name for hopscotch, is a good way to get the numbers to stick.

If you do need to get a test for a member of your household, once you get the result, please let us know the result. If we do get a positive case in school, we will work with the Public Health Team to identify close contacts and they will be asked to isolate.
