Hedgehogs News

This week we have started looking at non-fiction. The children are getting really good at identifying key features of a non-fiction text! We have started looking at questions, what they are and what symbol we use, ready for writing a fact file and describing animals next week. In PE we have been focusing on stopping when we run. Lots of children were originally doing a U-turn when they got to the end of the track but now we are all stopping experts! We can slow ourselves down to stop, stop, turn and run back. We had a wonderful Forest School session with parent helpers - thank you so much. We pretended to be birds and used clothes pegs as beaks to pick up 'worms' (pink wool). Then we searched for real worms and after that we built nests using moss, dried grass and sticks. The results were beautiful, complete with clay eggs and birds.

Squirrels News

On Tuesday we celebrated the Chinese New Year, learning about how it was the year of the tiger and how to get ready for the celebrations. We then had fun trying to eat our snack using chopsticks! In English we started our new unit based on Non-Fiction texts about animals. We wrote questions that we wanted to find the answers to and looked at the structure of a simple non-fiction text about Arctic seals. In maths we have been subtracting using different methods. We could use counters on ten frames and take away counters; we could use number lines and jump back in ones or larger jumps and finally we could use place value grids taking away tens and ones cubes. In DT we have been practising our sewing skills. We used running stitch to create a rectangle and some of us even had a go at overstitch. Everyone impressed me with their sewing skills as well as their Persevering Penguin attitude when it didn't always go smoothly. In Science and

Geography we learnt about how different animals adapt to their environment. We were especially intrigued that caribou antlers are shaped a little like snow shovels! Today it was Numbers Day and we had fun making and playing snakes and ladders, we even chalked enormous boards on the playground for the whole school to use. We have been using numbers up to 100 and making dice.

Badgers News

In Forest School, Badgers tried a blindfold walk in pairs and introduced the blindfolded person to a tree or something similar. They had to test the use of their senses to help return to the same spot once the blindfold was removed. The children also worked hard to find the letters of the orienteering course around the school grounds. They were totally absorbed in the challenge.

In Maths we have been focusing on subtracting in Maths. We used apparatus to practise exchanging and then started to record this using a written expanded method. We have also been looking at the link between cm and mm and using our knowledge of multiplying and dividing by 10 to calculate the equivalent measurement.

In Science we completed an investigation to identify electrical conductors and insulators. We made a simple circuit, putting in a range of items, to see if it would complete the circuit and light the bulb.

Foxes News

This week in Forest School, the children in Foxes did some orienteering around the school grounds. Orienteering is quite challenging map work in which you search for specific places and record the letters you find there - the children really enjoyed it. They also led their partners on a blindfolded walk to explore the area, testing their other senses. They trusted and supported each other well.

In Maths we have continued to add and subtract decimals, with the week the focus being on decimals with different tenths, hundredths and thousandths: For example, $136.4 - 83.218 =$. We discussed the importance of lining up the decimal point before solving. The children have demonstrated great problem-solving skills and all been "Reasoning Robins".

Finally, in RE the children have been learning about the founder of Sikhism: Guru Nanak. They have learnt about how his teachings are still followed by Sikhs today and how lots of the stories about him, such as "Malik Bhago and Lalo", have an important message for us all. Mr Abbott

Social Media Usage for Children: Safeguarding Advice

There are lots of social media websites and apps people use to chat, comment, share pictures and game with their friends.

Many parents and carers wonder when is the best age to let their child have a social media account. Some don't want their children to have underage accounts. Others may have decided their child is not quite ready for social networking, even if their child is begging them. Once children reach secondary school, they're likely to come under growing peer pressure to stay in touch with friends online.

ThinkUKnow is a website designed to help parents and carers answer these questions and more, including how to let your child get the most out of the internet in a safe, secure way.

The ThinkUKnow website is produced and supported by the The National Crime Agency and the Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre (CEOP) who work with safeguarding and child protection partners across the UK and overseas. It protects children from harm online and offline with a focus on child sexual exploitation and online protection issues.
