
Thank you to all of our families who have supported us as a school with your patience, understanding, commitment and kindness. This has truly helped with the smooth transition back into school after such a long period away.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING PARKING AND ROAD SAFETY

Due to Covid and our staggered start times we are using both school gates. This week there have been a couple of near misses on the main road due to parents parking by the side of the Church near the gates and by the grass.

PLEASE DO NOT park near the BIG BLUE GATES or next to the grass bank next to the church. There are solid white lines in the middle of the road and by parking here you are forcing other road users to cross the white lines to pass—causing a risk to other vehicles on the brow of the hill.

We will be asking the Traffic Police and Highway Agency to come out to monitor this stretch of road. Attendance matters

It is vital that children return to school for their educational progress, wellbeing and wider development. School attendance is mandatory again from the beginning of this new academic year. For parents and carers of children of compulsory school age, this means that the legal duty on you as a parent to send your child to school regularly applies.

As in other years holiday requests in term time will not be approved and you may be issued a fixed penalty notice by Dorset Council. Please also take into account the Covid quarantine restrictions on self-isolating when returning from some countries.

We are of course mindful that children are unwell from time to time and need to remain at home. Moreover, children may be unable to attend in line with public health advice because they are self-isolating and have had coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms or a positive test result themselves, or because they are a close contact of someone who has Coronavirus (COVID-19). If your child is unable to attend for this reason, you MUST contact school.

Free School Meals

Please can I encourage parents to apply for Free School Meals, if you are eligible? You do not have to have the meals but eligibility may mean that some trips are significantly cheaper for these families, and children eligible for Free School Meals attract additional funding to the school (which is important at this time of budget cuts). This applies to all families even if you are currently receiving UIFSM (universal infant free school meals). Free School Meals can be awarded if parents/carers are in receipt of:

* Income Support

- * Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- * Income Related Employment and Support Allowance

* Child Tax Credit (providing your annual income is less that £16,190)

- * Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- * Support Under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- * Working Tax Credit 'run on' *Universal Credit.

Please note, if you currently receive Working Tax Credit, you are not eligible to claim Free School Meals. However, if you become unemployed or reduce weekly working hours below 16, you can claim Free School Meals for a 4 week period after employment ceases or hours reduced.



Wallace and Gromit's Children's Charity

Most of you will be aware that Mrs Westerman-Loe is currently off work. Unfortunately, during the summer holiday Mrs Westerman-Loe's daughter Lily (a past pupil of St George's) suffered a bleed on the brain and was rushed to hospital by Air Ambulance. Lily remains in hospital in Bristol recovering. She is improving each week which is excellent news. I am sure you will join us in sending positive thoughts and prayers for Lily and the Westerman-Loe family.

The Wallace and Gromit's Children's Charity is a national charity raising funds to improve the lives of sick children in hospitals and hospices throughout the UK. They provide life-saving medical equipment, free family accommodation, a range of arts, music and play therapy programmes, sensory equipment and facilities and respite care.

To support the Wallace and Gromit Charity who are supporting the Westerman-Loe family we are holding a "Home Clothes" day on **Friday 18th September**. In return for a donation (suggested £1) the children are invited to come to school in their home clothes.

At the start and end of the day

In order to minimise congestion, and prevent classes mixing, children should be bought to school by just **ONE** parent/carer, please.
