It has been yet another busy week and surprisingly we are already halfway through this term. Unfortunately, we have seen the reoccurrence of Covid cases back in school this week. This is not a unique situation as many schools are also seeing a rise in cases. Thank you to everyone for being vigilant, testing children and helping us to limit the spread of cases as much as possible. It is really important to limit the spread, keep our children, staff, and families safe and to keep our school open.

Next week we are very much looking forward to welcoming parents into school to meet with the class teachers. We are keen to meet face to face and give you the opportunity to look through your child's work. Due to Safeguarding procedures in place during the school day, anyone arriving for an appointment before 3:15pm will need to sign in at the office where you will be given a visitor's lanyard to wear. You will then be shown into the school library to wait for your appointment and given the chance to look through your child's books. If you have Covid or have any Covid symptoms we are kindly requesting that you do not attend school and instead contact the office for an alternative meeting date, Teams call, or phone appointment to be arranged.

Over the next couple of weeks, the children will be taking part in a number of assessment activities for reading, writing and maths. Our Year 6 children will also be experiencing some mock SATs tests ahead of their statutory tests in May 2022. Please be reassured that staff plan these in a way which supports each child according to their needs and all children are simply encouraged to try their best. These assessments enable the teachers to plan how best to help your child move forward with their learning and make further progress as they move into the summer term.

Hedgehogs News

It has been a busy week in Hedgehogs this week. The children have worked so incredibly hard and all been superstar helpers for the cover teachers while Mrs Ramage has been off school.

In English the children have been using an alternate Three Little Pigs story where the pigs are in a flying competition with the wolf. They have thought of some amazing words for the Word Womble and used these to write sentences to describe different parts of the story.

In Maths we have been looking at halves and quarters. The children have enjoyed folding and cutting shapes and using the play dough to create halves and quarters.

Throughout the week the children have been investigating the history of flight focusing on hot air balloons. We had a lot of fun with papier mache on Tuesday afternoon as we made a start on our own hot air balloons. There was a lot of glue and newspaper everywhere! The children also worked independently to create some beautiful 3D paper hot air balloons.

We have made the most of the sunshine, enjoying practical floating and sinking science sessions outside along with using our new track for walk and talk sessions with everyone seeing how many times they could complete a circuit. We are very much looking forward to welcoming Mrs Ramage back next week.

Squirrels News

This week, in Squirrels, we have written our own version of a Wishing Tale. We planned it, story mapped it and then wrote it. I can't wait to read them! In maths we have moved on to a unit on Fractions. This week we learnt all about a half; being able to identify halves in shapes and quantities as well as being able to colour it in. The year 2s also looked at how ½ is written and also began to look at ¼. In Art we learnt about an artist who used papier-mâché to build her sculptures and we started to build a base for our own papier-mâché balloons. In Science we investigated different materials according to whether they could change shape or not. First, we learnt about what a prediction is and then made predictions about the different materials. Next, we investigated our predictions. We tried squashing, twisting, stretching and bending different materials. We came to some good conclusions and tried hard to explain our reasons. In History we learnt about the Wright Brothers and how they were the first people to fly an aeroplane. In forest school we made dream catchers. Have a lovely weekend everyone. In Badgers this week we started to make our predator models from shoeboxes, paper plates and egg boxes. We focused on creating the opening mechanism powered by air. We wrote a toolkit of the features of this text type and listed effective verbs and adverbs. We used our knowledge of times tables in Maths to solve problems involving scaling and made lots of towers with different coloured bricks.

The children in Foxes have had another busy week. In Forest School with Ms Rankin, the children restored the area's signs, using their designing, painting and hammering skills. The children also finished their dream catchers by adding feathers, beads and leaves on the outer willow circle.

In Music the children had their next session learning the ukulele. This week they learnt their first chord - C Major. The children then used it to play in two parts with half of the children finger picking and the other half strumming.

Finally, in our topic of "On Our Doorstep" the children compared a recent map of Bourton with one from the 1980s. The children enjoyed investigating changes that have taken place over the years including the closure of The Red Lion Inn, the moving of the village hall and the building of the A303. The children then shared their ideas to why these changes may have occurred.

Important Covid-19 Update

As you all know, there have been changes in the restrictions around Covid-19 so here is an update on the main changes and how they affect us at school.

- Although the law has been removed, anyone with a positive PCR or LFT test or who is symptomatic is advised to isolate. We therefore ask that if your child has Covid, they do not come to school.
- The time scales have not changed. People are advised to isolate for 5 days and then not return to school until they have had 2 negative tests 24 hours apart up to 10 days.
- Close contacts are now only people that you live with or who have had an overnight stay with.
- Schools are no longer routinely expected to test.
- If we have cases in school, other children / adults are no longer expected to test daily for 7 days.

Although there have been changes to law, many principles still stand. We want well children and well adults in school and although we know that we will unknowingly have asymptomatic children and adults in school we ask that you support us with being vigilant and monitoring symptoms.

Please test if your child has symptoms and isolate as we are advised to do. We need to continue to do all we can to keep our children, staff, and families safe.


