


Achievements Out of School

This week Hedgehogs started the topic of World Kitchen. We investigated the seasonality of fruits and where our fruit comes from in the world. We also used a computer simulation programme to grow different plants.

In English sessions we have started a unit on Red Riding Hood. We walked through the woodland area thinking about all the sights, sounds, smells and feelings Little Red would have had on her way to Grandma's House. We will use these ideas in our writing.

In Maths we have been making the numbers from 11 to 20 using various resources. The year 1 children have been looking at making larger numbers as well.

Today the children enjoyed a day finding out about St. George. We made dragons and dragon eggs for our house challenge and enjoyed lots of different dragon activities. It was great fun!

It has been a lovely week and we have enjoyed the sunshine doing outdoor maths and lots of outdoor

explore time.

It has been great to welcome the children back to Squirrels class after the Easter break – they have returned with lots of enthusiasm, an eagerness to learn and bags of energy.

In Maths, they have been learning about the unit of Position and Direction and focussed on describing movements and turns. On Wednesday with Mrs Welshman, the children went on the playground and had to give their partners directions to follow to find the treasure. They had to use the key vocabulary of forwards, backwards, left and right as well as clockwise and anticlockwise turns.

In Art the children have been refining their sketching skills. Using different pencils (ranging from B to 6B) they went on to the field to sketch the trees on our school grounds. They looked closely at the different details on the trees and used their pencils to add shade and texture to their sketches.

Finally, we have welcomed Miss Finn to our team. We have enjoyed getting to know her and she has supported us with our learning. We look forward to working with her over the next few weeks.

Badgers News –

This week in Badgers we have enjoyed welcoming in two new pupils - Ed and Milly - (and Mrs Welshman to our team!); they are a lovely addition to our Badgers class. We hope they will love St George's.

We have started our new topic, which is the Stone Age. On Monday, the children started their Science 'rocks and fossils' topic and they looked at igneous rock and how it is formed. We explored just how long ago the Stone Age really started, using a timeline outside on the swimming pool fence, and found out when the first cave painting was made, the first Stonehenge stone set and when the first upright 'human' walked. The children learnt that prehistory is discovered through archaeology. We had a go ourselves at being archaeologists, digging in sand and finding pictures of types of stone and flint tools. Later in the week we tried to make our own stone age cave art using our desks on their sides as the walls of the caves. The results were wonderful!

Thursday was the 51st 'Earth Day' and we discussed global warming and ways in which we can help. Today (Friday) is St George's Day - a big day for our school of course - and we have had a 'make a collage dragon' house challenge as well as coming into school dressed in red and white. The weather has been lovely and we have spent as much time outside as possible. The term has started with a great few days. Ms Rankin and Mrs Welshman

We started off our topic of dragons with reading dragon poetry and then wrote our own poems using similes and positive and negative imagery. In Art, we used water colour pencils to draw our dragons, focusing on colour and shading.

In Maths we tried to be bargain hunters and calculated percentage increases and decreases. The children were keen to consider what they would do with the money they had saved! This also fitted into our PSHE work, thinking about saving and spending.

We are all trying to get fit and improve our stamina so we started the Couch to 5K this week, around the school field.

You can arrange a test through <u>https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-</u> <u>coronavirus-test or by phoning 119.</u>

The symptoms to look out for are:

- New, persistent cough
- High temperature
- Change to sense of taste or smell

If you do need to get a test for a member of your household, once you get the result, please let us know the result. If we do get a positive case in school, we will work with the Public Health Team to identify close contacts and they will be asked to isolate.
