What a scorcher! I have definitely wanted to jump in the pool several times this week! The children have thoroughly enjoyed their swimming lessons and have been focusing on their leg action, position in the water and breathing technique. In English we started our 'Meeting Tale' focus and read the story of Sharing a Shell where the crab meets an anemone and a bristle-worm. We have story mapped the adapted version and have practiced story-telling it to each other. We have also learnt about apostrophes and how they replace missing letters in words like I'm, don't and you're. In Maths, we have completed some place value investigations, using our knowledge of tens and ones. They then had to set up their circuit so that only one switch controlled one bulb or buzzer. There were lots of great discussions going on in the classroom and the children were all "Teamwork Tigers" as they managed to create parallel circuits that allowed them to achieve their goals.

Finally, in swimming the children have been focussing on front crawl. We discussed how firstly we need to have a flat streamline body position in the water. Then we need to lift one arm out of the water with a bent elbow and reach forward over the water before entering our finger tips, making sure we breath to the side. Finally, we need to remember to have relaxed and flexible ankles, point our toes behind you and kick up-and-down in a continuous motion from your thighs. All the children did a great job and we most definitely have a few future swimming stars. Keep up the good work.
