From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision.

Impact Report 2023/2024

Our Sport Premium Funding for the last academic year was: £16, 730. This money was used as follows and impacted as detailed below:

Action Plan for Current Year 2024/2025

Our Sport Premium Funding for the current academic year is: £16,290. The following plan details how we plan to use the money to maintain and improve provision.

Activity	Budget	Anticipated Impact
Sports Coaching - PE lessons	£6800	Children will continue to develop the P.E skills gained from previous years and will have access to a range of sporting opportunities taught by qualified sports coaches. Staff will gain valuable CPD and will receive of lesson plans, which include progression of skills. Focus on Gymnastics and Dance sessions.
Continuation of after school and lunchtime sporting sessions/ activities for children.	£1500	Increased number of children meeting their daily physical activity goal. A great variety of children encouraged and trying new sporting activities.
Get Set 4 PE	£750	Teachers planning and using an agreed scheme of work which offers skill development and support and extension ideas.
Swimming Provision	£2750	Children will develop their swimming skills and water safety awareness. This will provide vital opportunities to children who otherwise would not have an opportunity to learn this life skill. Staff will be trained in Level 1 swim teach training as well as Reach and Rescue training as CPD.
Hosting, transport to other venues and Staffing for Sports Competitions	£750	Increasing the number of opportunities for children to participate in sports competitions. This will especially benefit children whose parents are unable to provide transport or to accompany their child to events.
Residential trips	£1000	To enable all Y6 children and Y4/5 children to attend residential experience and wide range of high-risk level activities. Cost goes towards transport to all children. Experience of Orienteering and outward bounds activities.
Equipment and resources	£750	PE and sport provision will be resourced with high quality and appropriate equipment and materials. Children will have a rich, engaging P.E curriculum linked to National Curriculum objectives.
Equipment, training and resources for Forest school area within the school grounds.	£1200	To ensure a Forest School programme can run effectively and efficiently an area needs to be set up and resources within the school grounds.

Subscription to Gillingham Area Family Sports Group	£2000	Increasing the number of opportunities for children to participate in sports competitions. Enables the support and training for staff via the School Games Organiser. This will benefit children whose parents are unable to provide transport or to accompany their child to events
