We started to think more about woodlands and identified the leaves of a variety of commonly found British trees. The children have done leaf rubbings and have had a go at botanical illustrations of leaves and seeds. In Science this term we will be discovering how the detailed properties of plants and flowers enable them to disperse seeds and reproduce.

The swimming sessions have been a highlight this week too. Despite the lockdown non-swimming period, the children's swimming looks fantastic! We are also practising our athletics skills - relay, sprinting, jumping and throwing. Next week, we have a visiting Tri- Golf teacher to give the children an experience of that sport.

In English we are finishing off our persuasive brochure writing, in preparation for trying our own persuasive text.

Musical notes: there have also been the encouraging signs of the new Badgers' violinists filling the school; meanwhile Samba is still going strong - and is great fun- and we're hoping that other children sign up for next term's group woodwind lessons!

Covid19 Update:

You must book a test for the symptomatic person and phone or email the school office to let us know.

You can arrange a test through <https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test> or by phoning 119.

The symptoms to look out for are:

- New, persistent cough
- High temperature
- Change to sense of taste or smell

If you do need to get a test for a member of your household, once you get the result, please let us know the result. If we do get a positive case in school, we will work with the Public Health Team to identify close contacts and they will be asked to isolate.
