Hedgehogs News Another great week of learning from Hedgehogs! This week in maths, we have been learning about the order of numbers and comparing different representations of them – numicon, counters, number cards, cubes, tens frames, etc. The reception children have ordered numbers to 20 and played number line games in pairs. The Year 1s have revised using <,> and = to compare numbers up to 50 and beyond. In English sessions we have continued writing our Little Red Riding Hood stories. This week we made a large outline of Little Red Riding Hood (by drawing around Niamh!) and labelled it with what the character wore and what she took in her basket to Grandma's house. The Year 1s have been working hard to include adjectives to describe the objects in her basket. In science, we have been looking at what plants need to grow and have planted some cress. We will be watching them closely over the following weeks. In our topic work we have been learning more about vegetables and which part of the plant we eat. We have also been learning about acceptance and friendship in our PSHE sessions. We read a story about Harold the

Giraffe and his friends who are all very different in various ways. They all shared a scarf together and accepted one another's differences. We also read The Colour Monster to explore our different feelings and what colour we associate with each feeling. Finally, today they had a virtual fire safety lesson on Teams. The children learnt about how to stay safe at home and what to do in the event of an emergency. A great week!

Squirrels News

It has been another busy week in Squirrels class. In Science with Mrs Welshman the children have been identifying wildflowers before learning about their importance in nature. They then planted some wild flowers around the school grounds to encourage bees and other insects to pay us a visit.

In Maths the children have been counting up to 100. They have partitioned the numbers into 10s and 1s, written numbers in words and in figures, ordered numbers from smallest to biggest and compared them using the phrases: "greater than" and "less than."

In English they have been editing sentences from the story Little Red Riding Hood. They have added adjectives, adverbs, similes and alliteration to make the sentences more exciting and have enjoyed adding their own ideas to change the story plot.

Finally, today they had a virtual fire safety lesson on Teams. The children learnt about how to stay safe at home and what to do in the event of an emergency. Mr Abbott



Badgers News

This week Badgers have continued to research the Stone Age and we have learnt about the changes between the Palaeolithic, the Mesolithic and the Neolithic Ages. We have looked at a map of the area between Avebury and Stonehenge and made miniature long barrows in clay, using dismembered Lego people as the dead in the burial chambers. In the Neolithic age, people started to bury their dead. We also made Stonehenge out of Bourbon biscuits and pink wafers. It's amazing to think these important parts of our heritage date back to approx. 3,000 BCE.

We have had our first visit from a visiting Dorset music Hub teacher. Badgers are doing a ten-week programme of Samba drumming. Great fun and fantastic for listening and counting but a bit noisy; don't worry, no practice at home needed as these drums aren't portable!

We are getting into our Summer Sports - striking, fielding and athletics- in PE.

We've been impressed with Badgers and their focus in our writing sessions. They are using some fantastic expressive vocabulary.





Foxes News

In Foxes this week we have been reading about the Dorset Ridge-back dragon. We identified features of non-chronological reports and wrote a toolkit to remind ourselves about how to structure this text type. We then went out on location as nature programme presenters and dragonologists to film what we know about the dragon. The children really enjoyed this and we had lots of Team Work Tigers and problem solvers with i-pads being propped in trees and along fences for hands free filming.

In DT we explored a range of toys which are powered by a cams mechanism and considered how this impacts on the movement of the toy. We are hoping to make a model of a dragon with a moving part powered by a cam.

Foxes have shown great determination with their fractions in maths this week and have been adding and subtracting mixed fractions and considered the impact of this. We considered how to model these using apparatus or images.

We enjoyed describing ourselves in French, focusing on eye colour and hair colour. Amazingly we discovered that noone in Foxes has green eyes; only blue or brown! We moved onto week 2 of the Couch to 5K although we had to give in to the rain in the end and retire a little early; we are hoping we can finish this stage next week.

The symptoms to look out for are:

- New, persistent cough
- High temperature
- Change to sense of taste or smell

If you do need to get a test for a member of your household, once you get the result, please let us know the result. If we do get a positive case in school, we will work with the Public Health Team to identify close contacts and they will be asked to isolate.

Attendance

Now that school is open fully, it is essential that children attend whenever they are well enough, so that they can make the most of the learning opportunities on offer.

We would appreciate it if you could make all non-urgent appointments, such as routine dentist appointment, out of school hours to ensure your child has the best possible attendance.

Although we recognise the inconvenience caused by holidays being postponed due to COVID, we are not able to authorise holidays taken in term time unless it is for an exceptional reason.

We will be reviewing attendance and punctuality over the next two weeks and will be in contact if your child's attendance or punctuality is a cause for concern.

As a general rule, we class good attendance as being 95% or higher. If your child's attendance is between 90% and 95% we will review the reasons given. If your child's attendance falls below 90%, this is classed as persistent absence and we have a duty to report it into the Local Authority.

Home Learning

The class teachers are still using Microsoft Teams each week for homework tasks (spellings and mental maths). We have decided to continue to use this platform for home learning as we hope it will encourage children to keep practising the skills of logging on in case we are ever in a position where remote learning is required again. If you do have any questions regarding home learning, please do email your child's class teacher.
